This funding will be used to


- Improve the whole school internal moderation processes (M1 M4) to ensure 100% students are actively engaged in the required aspects of the Australian Curriculum and A-E data is quality assured.
- Build staff capability in the M1 moderation process.
- Map 100% of all students in Prep Year 2 using Early Start to track progress and inform planning in the Early Years in literacy and numeracy.
- Increase staff knowledge of the alignment between Literacy Continuum and Australian Curriculum.
- Build staff capability in implementing the Student Code of Conduct to ensure active learning environments.

Our initiatives include

- Teachers undertake cooperative M1 planning sessions with Head of Department, with a focus on building staff capability to develop:
 - > pre-assessment tasks to inform unit planning and differentiation
 - a deep understanding of summative assessment and associated marking guides to determine instructional routines, next steps for improvement and cognitive demands
 - > a student centred feedback cycle utilising the marking guides.
- All staff to be trained in Essential Skills for Classroom Management.
- Teaching staff to engage in Classroom Profiling and Zones of Regulation professional development.
- Teaching staff to undertake further training in Literacy Continuum in Oneschool.
- Refine Student Support Team processes and implement a systematic whole school case management approach.

Employ Head of Department (Curriculum) to assist in building staff capability in moderation processes (M1-M4), Essential Skills for Classroom Management, case management and facilitating professional development aligned to whole school professional learning plan.
